Assumptions

Of the 3,200 jails in the USA, approximately 80% (2,500) have 200 beds or less (“America’s Small Jails”) – typically rural county jails.

While there are many resources for prisons, large jails, and Federal detention centers, small jails are without even the most basic set of resources to bring true transformation to adults and juveniles sentenced there.

Some jail leaders (sheriffs, chaplains, judges, etc.) are going to hear of the amazing stories from transforming jails and want to have similar results in their jails, too.
